Today, we commemorate the humanitarian service of the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and Our Beloved Community. Mahatma Gandhi inspired the world with these words, "Be the change you wish to see in the world." The revolutionary power of nonviolence, engaged with strategic resistance, was the cornerstone of the Civil Rights Movement and was influenced by Gandhian philosophy. This nonviolent social action became the template for every other progressive movement in North America and around the globe.
